



Appealing a Social Security Disability Claim

We know how frustrating it can be to find out that your Social Security benefits have been denied. Fortunately, there **are** ways to appeal your claim. These are the steps that you can take to receive benefits.

1. Request a Hearing

If your claim is initially denied, you will need to request a hearing before an administrative law judge. This request needs to be completed within 60 days of the initial application denial.

2. Request Review from the Appeals Council

If you lose your disability hearing, you will need to request review from the Appeals Council. The Appeals Council has the discretion to remand your case for another hearing, grant your claim or deny your claim.

3. File a Lawsuit

If the Appeals Council denies your request for review, you will need to file a lawsuit in U.S. District Court.
