What is a Disability?

"Disability" is defined under the Social Security Regulations as a "total disability." The Social Security Administration will consider a combination of your medical impairments, including physical and mental along with work related and non worked related.

How Does Social Security Define Disability?

You must prove that you are unable to do your previous job or any other job in the national economy. If you are over the age 54, you have to prove that you cannot do your previous work. The Social Security Administration will consider your age, education and prior work experience in making a determination. The disability must be expected to last twelve consecutive months or result in death.

Your disability needs to be supported by medical records from treating and examining medical sources.

If you are missing work due to an injury or illness, we can help you pursue the benefits of Social Security disability. Our experienced attorneys will handle everything from evaluating your situation to reviewing and preserving evidence to support your application for benefits.
